

Have fun and enjoy all that ANZAHPE 2023 offers.





Dr Subha Ramani

President of AMEE, An International Association for Health Professions Education
Subha Ramani, MBBS, MPH, MMEd (Dundee),
PhD (Maastricht), FAMEE

Subha Ramani is a general internist, who graduated from Stanley Medical College, University of Madras with MBBS in 1986 and completed Internal Medicine residencies at the Postgraduate Institute for Medical Education and Research (PGIMER), Chandigarh, India as well as James H. Quillen College of Medicine, East Tennessee State University, Johnson City, TN, USA. She went on to do a Fellowship in General Internal Medicine at Boston University School of Medicine, completing a Masters in Public Health at the Boston University School of Public Health in 1998. In 2005, she graduated with a Masters in Medical Education from the University of Dundee in Scotland and successfully defended her PhD at Maastricht University in the Netherlands in 2018. She served as the 2022 Ronald Harden Visiting Professor at International Medical University.

She is Associate Professor of Medicine at Harvard Medical School, Boston, USA; Adjunct Professor at Massachusetts General Hospital Institute for Health Professions Education; Honorary Professor of Medical Education at the University of Manchester, UK; and External faculty at School of Health Professions Education (SHE), Maastricht University. At Brigham and Women's Hospital (BWH), she has the following leadership roles: Director of evaluation for Internal Medicine residency programme; Director for the Scholars in Medical Education residency pathway; Director of the Program for research, innovation and scholarship in medical education (PRISE) for the Department of Medicine; Assistant Director for global perspectives and community for the Brigham Education Institute. Dr. Ramani is a senior core faculty at the Harvard Macy Institute.

Dr. Ramani has been a longstanding member of AMEE, completing two terms of three years each on the Executive board, chaired the Fellowship Committee for 4 years and served on the AMEE Postgraduate Education committee for 3 years.



Prof Shaun Ewen

Professor Shaun Ewen B.App.Sc. (Physio) (UniSA), M.Int.St. (UniSA), and D.Ed. (Melb) Professor Shaun Ewen is the Deputy Vice Chancellor (Education) at Griffith University, a role he commenced in January 2022.

Prior to joining Griffith, Professor Ewen was Pro Vice-Chancellor (Place and Indigenous) (2017-2022) and Foundation Director of the Melbourne Poche Centre for Indigenous Health, Faculty of Medicine, Dentistry and Health Sciences, (2015-2022) at the University of Melbourne. In 2020 Professor Ewen was visiting Professor of Indigenous Health and Leadership in the School of Global Affairs, King's College London. Shaun has degrees in Applied Science (Physiotherapy) and International Studies from the University of South Australia, and a Doctorate of Education focussing on medical education, from the University of Melbourne.

He practiced as a physio for around a decade, in remote, regional and urban Australia, the United Kingdom, and South Africa.

Shaun's research interests are in Indigenous health workforce development, and health professional education. He has provided the academic and Indigenous leadership for the Leaders in Indigenous Medical Education (LIME) project, a bi-national project bringing together all medical schools across Australia and New Zealand. Shaun is a Board Member of Queensland Museum Network, Director of the Australian Medical Council (and Chair of the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Committee), and Board Member of the Menzies Australia Institute, King's College London.

Shaun is passionate about the importance of diversity and inclusion as a precondition for excellence in higher education.

Gillian Mason, University of Newcastle

Gillian Mason is a proudly disabled and chronically ill health consumer and patient representative who is also a physiotherapist-researcher with >18 years' experience of the health system from 'both sides of the bedside'.

With the Australian Department of Health, Gillian is the Deputy Chair of the Health Technology Assessment Consumer Consultative Committee, and a member of the Medical Service Advisory Committee. She is a Director of the Australasian Institute of Digital Health and is working with stakeholders across the health sector to develop an interdisciplinary Clinical Informatics Fellowship program for clinicians.

At Hunter Medical Research Institute (Awabakal Land, Newcastle NSW), as Consumer and Community Involvement Lead, she manages the Research Volunteer and Stroke Research Registers and provides strategic advice, education, training and mentorship around consumer and community involvement in all stages of the research process to research teams, educators and students.

She is passionate about improving access, inclusion and equity in healthcare for consumers and workforce. In 2021 she was one of 25 Australian women to be awarded the inaugural Brilliant Women in Digital Health Award for transforming the ways that people's lived experience is valued and included in the design of human-centred, digitally enabled, accessible health systems.

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Dr Mike Todorovic

Dr Mike Todorovic, Griffith University

Dr Mike Todorovic is a Senior Lecturer of Anatomy and Physiology at Griffith University in the School of Nursing and Midwifery. He has developed an impressive reputation for his ability to communicate the complexities of the human body across a range of traditional and social media platforms - reaching over 10 million people every month. He is well known for his medical education YouTube channel, Dr Matt and Dr Mike, with over 35 million views and half a million subscribers. His podcast, of the same name, is in the top 1% most shared podcasts globally and is a Top 10 Medicine podcast on both Spotify and iTunes with over 2 million downloads. He has worked extensively on radio and television, with over 150 ABC Radio call back segments and multiple television shows, including being a lead scientist on the National Geographic docuseries, 'Limitless' with Chris Hemsworth.

He has won multiple awards for his teaching and engagement, including a citation for outstanding innovation and scholarship, and the Pro-Vice Chancellors Staff Excellence Award for Engagement. He has been awarded over \$1.3 million in research funding and published over 25 peer reviewed articles and textbook chapters.



Sydney Children's Hospital Network/ KidsResus / Kids Simulation Australia

The Sydney Children's Hospitals Network cares for thousands of children each year in our hospitals and in their homes with one purpose in mind, to help young people live their healthiest lives. Our education programs make this achievable by providing health staff within other hospitals the skills and knowledge to care for paediatric patients allowing them to stay close to home.

Kids Simulation Australia is a centre of excellence in the area of paediatric simulated learning. Simulation provides a priceless training opportunity using advanced technology to replicate real-life scenarios and allow for experiential learning, education innovation, collaboration and research.

Kids Simulation Australia focuses on applying innovative and evidence-based simulation techniques to allow paediatric healthcare professionals a safe, immersive experience that improves knowledge and skill development. These experiences are aimed at ensuring high quality care is provided to all paediatric patients.

Kids Simulation Australia courses support health professionals to improve their knowledge and skills in caring for neonatal and paediatric patients across the state. KSA also provides and supports courses aimed at developing neonatal and paediatric simulation faculty.

KidsResus is a Paediatric Resuscitation Education and Training Program offered to all health professionals who care for paediatric patients. It provides participants with the knowledge and skills to treat and stabilise a paediatric patient suffering a critical event. This course allows you to gain more than just Basic Life Support skills. It provides information and simulated scenarios depicting real life events within your own environment. This program enables you to focus on the A-G assessment of the critically unwell infant or child and offers you skills and knowledge, to not only assess each area, but trouble shoot and treat anomalies that are discovered.

The KidsResus Education and Training Program is facilitated by local trainers allowing for relevant and targeted simulated scenarios. The Simulation course of the program is broken into 2 components and designed to be completed in 60 minutes. The first component allows the participants to explore how Human Factors can affect the outcome of a Paediatric Critical event. This is achieved with the use of videos, games and discussion. The second component of the practical training allows the participants to use simulation to practice the skills acquired from completing the e learning. Not only is the resuscitation algorithm of DRSABCD given a practical component, the participants will perform an A-G assessment to help determine the underlying cause of the collapse of their paediatric patient.





Members could also have assess to the new electronic clinical skills exam module, eOSCE app, to conduct clinical examinations using mobile devices with real time monitoring and electronic marking.






